# 1

## Getting to Know Nevo<sup>SL</sup>

Nevo<sup>SL</sup> is a universal controller that intuitively delivers complete audio-visual and digital media control for your networked home. It features infrared signaling for audio-visual control, WiFi (802.11b) signaling for digital media control, and an optional NevoLink for multi-room control.

Nevo<sup>SL</sup> can be completely customized to match your home theater system. If your installer/integrator has configured Nevo<sup>SL</sup> for you, it is already configured to control your system.

NevoMedia Manager makes it easy for you to connect, control, and interact with digital media in your networked home. In addition to controlling your home theater devices, Nevo<sup>SL</sup> incorporates Universal Plug-and-Play (UPnP)<sup>TM</sup> technology, which will automatically discover new digital media content and devices using the Media Management features. See “How Do I Control Digital Media?” on page 7 for details.

Together, these elements deliver seamless, customized control of your home theater and networked digital media. Welcome to Nevo<sup>SL</sup>, a new evolution in home control.


## Using Nevo<sup>SL</sup> Keys and Touchscreen

Nevo<sup>SL</sup> contains the following types of controls:

- customizable hard keys on the remote's front that let you control common device features
- fully-interactive touchscreen that provides functions for your devices appropriate to your pattern of use
- function-specific keys on the sides

## Keys

Nevo<sup>SL</sup> offers several keys on the front and sides.




### Customizable Keys

The keys on Nevo<sup>SL</sup>'s front can be customized to your preference. An additional set of programmable, unlabeled function keys appear immediately below the touchscreen, above the keys. A label appears on the touchscreen above them to indicate the functions assigned to those keys.

### Side Keys and Ports

Nevo<sup>SL</sup> has additional, non-customizable keys on the sides:



- Press the **Backlight** key to turn the back light on or off manually
- Move the **Toggle Wheel** up and down to move between the pages in Home Control or through the media listings in Media Control. Press the toggle wheel to return to the first page of the page collection.
- Use the stylus to move the On/Off switch to **Off** if you will be away from home for an extended period. This conserves your battery power.


**Note:** Only use the stylus to move the On/Off switch.

- In the rare instance Nevo<sup>SL</sup> fails to operate properly, use the stylus to press the **Reset Button**.

## Touchscreen

Nevo<sup>SL</sup>'s fully-customizable touch screens can be set up via NevoStudio. See *NevoStudio Design Guide* for more information on creating configurations.

To use the touchscreen, gently touch the buttons that appear on it. If you prefer, slide the stylus from its storage port on the bottom of the Nevo<sup>SL</sup>:



Using the stylus, gently touch buttons on the touchscreen to control your home theater system or digital media. You may prefer to always use the stylus when you are configuring settings (see “Nevo<sup>SL</sup> Settings” on page 21).

## Using Nevo<sup>SL</sup> Menus

If your installer/integrator has configured Nevo<sup>SL</sup> to show the menu, the menu contains three items:

- Use **Home Control** to operate your home electronic devices. See “How Do I Control Home Entertainment Devices? (Home Control)” on page 5 for more information.
- Use **Media Control** to control digital media. See “How Do I Control Digital Media?” on page 7 for more information.
- Use **Settings** to set Nevo<sup>SL</sup>'s backlight, on time, etc. See “Nevo<sup>SL</sup> Settings” on page 21 for more information.

# 2 How Do I Control Home Entertainment Devices? (Home Control)

## Starting Home Control

Home Control starts as soon as you turn Nevo<sup>SL</sup> on. If the last person to use Nevo<sup>SL</sup> left it in Media Control, you can switch by pressing the Home Control button on the left-hand side.

Although the screens can be customized to contain device control buttons in whatever order and grouping you want, certain screen elements remain the same:

- **Menu**

Touch  to choose a set of screens (if your installer/integrator has configured Nevo<sup>SL</sup> to show the menu):



- **Home Control** opens the customized device control screens set up on your Nevo<sup>SL</sup>. Touch a control or navigation button. See your home entertainment device's user manual for specific information on how to operate its features. See "Controlling a Device" on page 6 for more information on the navigation buttons.
- **Media Management** (if enabled by your installer/integrator) opens the digital media control screens. When you touch this item, Nevo<sup>SL</sup> finds your digital devices, and displays media control options. See "How Do I Control Digital Media?" on page 7 for more information.
- **Settings** (if enabled by your installer/integrator) opens a group of settings you can change on your Nevo<sup>SL</sup>. See "Nevo<sup>SL</sup> Settings" on page 21 for more information.

- **About Nevo<sup>SL</sup>** displays a screen of copyright and system configuration information. If you have trouble with Nevo<sup>SL</sup>, customer support staff or your installer/integrator may ask you for this information.

### System Status

This bar displays a set of icons that indicate system status:



-  shows whether an IR signal is being sent. When there appear to be red lines emitting from this base, Nevo<sup>SL</sup> is sending an IR signal.
-  indicates WiFi status. If bars appear, you are connected to a network. If no bars appear, you are not connected to a network. If there is no WiFi icon, WiFi is not enabled.
-  shows the remaining battery life. The lower this bar, the less battery power is available. When the bar reaches the bottom and turns red, dock and recharge you Nevo<sup>SL</sup>. You do not need to wait until the bar is all the way at the bottom before recharging. When Nevo<sup>SL</sup> is docked, the level cycles from low to high.
-  displays the current time. See “Setting the Date and Time” on page 24 for information on setting or changing the time.

### Navigation

Touch these buttons to cycle through the Home Control screens in a given page collection. You can also use the toggle wheel to navigate between these screens.



The touch area for the arrows extends into the function key labels, so you have plenty of space to touch.

## Controlling a Device

Control any home entertainment device by touching the touchscreen. Your installer/integrator has configured the home control section to best suit your home control environment. These pages may vary, but will always contain a Home page, which is your starting point. Consult your installer/integrator for more information on how your Nevo<sup>SL</sup> Home Control pages are configured.

# 3 How Do I Control Digital Media?

**Note:** This feature is only available if your installer/integrator has enabled it.

## How Do I Set Up NevoMedia Manager?

You can use your Nevo<sup>SL</sup> to play and control digital media content stored on the computers inside your home. This enables you to either stream content from one computer to another, or to play the content on any UPnP-compliant (Universal Plug and Play) digital media player.

Nevo<sup>SL</sup> includes NevoMedia Manager, which comes with two media tools:

- **NevoMedia Server** allows your personal computer to act as a media server. You can use Nevo<sup>SL</sup> to choose media stored on your computer to play on your digital devices.
- **NevoMedia Player** allows your personal computer to act as a digital media player that you control from your Nevo<sup>SL</sup>.

To install NevoMedia Server and Player, run the NevoMedia Manager installation program from the CD.

**Note:** NevoMedia Server will start up by default every time you boot up your computer. If you want to change this setting, remove the shortcut to NevoMedia Server from the Startup Program Group.

**Note:** NevoMedia Player will start up by default every time NevoMedia Server starts up. If you want to change this setting, from the NevoMedia Server application, go to the **Tools** menu, then uncheck the **Launch NevoMedia Server at Startup** option. You only need to change this setting if you plan on using a digital media player other than NevoMedia Player. Nevo<sup>SL</sup> is configured to take full advantage of NevoMedia Server and NevoMedia Player to offer the best digital media experience.

See the online help for more information about using NevoMedia Server and NevoMedia Player.

# How do I Update My Media?

## NevoMedia Server

Each time NevoMedia Server starts, it scans any directories you or your installer/integrator set up as containing your digital media. If you have added any new files and set up these folders to be watched, they will appear in the server.


If you want to add a new folder:

1. Open the media server by double-clicking the media server icon in your Windows system tray:



**Media Server icon**

The main Media Server window opens:



Your installer/integrator should have set up the basic media folders when NevoMedia Server and Player were first installed.

2. Click  to start the Media Collection wizard:




3. Click **Next** to begin creating your Media Library:



Since you are adding to an existing collection, the wizard automatically selects Custom Setup for you.

4. Click **Next** to identify the specific folder(s) you want to scan.



5. Check next to the folder you want to add. If you *don't* want these folders scanned and updated every time Media Server starts, uncheck **Update**.
6. Click **Next**. The wizard scans the folder(s) and adds to the collection. When the wizard is finished, click **Finish**.


## Other Media Servers

## How Do I Use Nevo<sup>SL</sup> to Control Media?

It's easy to start up Media Zones and begin enjoying your digital media. Access Media Zones by touching the menu item on the Nevo<sup>SL</sup> main menu or the control button your installer/integrator has set up.

Your Nevo<sup>SL</sup> will automatically display the media zones your installer/integrator set up for you. A media zone is a linked combination of media server and player.



The zones appear first as grayed-out text, then, as the devices in each zone become ready, they turn black. Only those zones that your installer/integrator has enabled will turn black. A highlight bar shows which zone is currently ready to be selected. Touch a zone name, use the key arrows and **OK** key, or use the toggle wheel to select the Media Zone from the associated server and control its playback on the player.

For information on setting up media servers and players, see “How Do I Set Up NevoMedia Manager?” on page 7. For information on configuring the wireless settings, see “Nevo<sup>SL</sup> Settings” on page 21.

## Navigating NevoMedia Manager

From the Media Zone screen, you can easily begin choosing and viewing or playing digital media on the server set up for the zone you chose:



Touch a media choice, use the key arrows and **OK** key, or use the toggle wheel to select a media choice:



Use the up and down arrows to scroll through any list. When the highlight bar is on your choice, press the **OK** key or the toggle wheel.

If your media is organized in folders, those folders appear first. Touch a folder name, use the key arrows and **OK** key, or use the toggle wheel to select and open a folder.



If there are more items that can appear on one screen, a vertical scroll bar appears on the screen:



Touch the up and down arrows or use the stylus to drag the marker. You can also use the key arrows and **OK** key, or use the toggle wheel to scroll through the list.

## How Do I Use Nevo<sup>SL</sup> to Control Media?

If any item title is too long to fit on the screen, it will scroll automatically when you highlight it, so you can see the full title:




The files and folders that appear after you select a media type are based on the contents of the NevoMedia Server. They are dynamic—if you change the contents of the server, these choices will change. Your menus may not look like the examples provided here.

NevoMedia Server will always know what types of files belong to which of these categories, and will display any folders it catalogs as having files of that media type under each choice.

For example, if you store album art in your My Music folder on your computer, any music files from that folder will appear under My Music, **and** any album art image files will appear in a My Music folder under My Pictures.

## How do I Use the Media Zones Menu?

You can control the appearance and functions of the NevoMedia Player window from Nevo<sup>SL</sup>. Click the Menu function key:



This opens the menu:




From this menu, you can do the following:


- Change the Window Mode:
  - Choose **Full Screen** to expand the NevoMedia Player window to the full size of your monitor.
  - Choose **Minimize** to reduce the NevoMedia Player window to the Windows Task Bar (whether you are viewing the window or full screen).
  - Choose **Restore** to expand the NevoMedia Player window from the Windows Task Bar. It will restore to whichever mode it was in (window or full screen) when you minimized it.
  - Choose **Info Bar** to turn the information bar at the bottom of the window or screen on or off.
- Choose which type of media is always on top (pictures, videos, or music). This enables you to run a slide show, for example, with music in the background, without the music window coming to the front each time the song changes.
- Choose a music or video play option:
  - **Shuffle** plays the tracks or clips in the current folder in random order.
  - **Repeat** plays the current track repeatedly until you turn it off.
- Choose **Slideshow** and set a viewing interval (in seconds) to show each picture in the selected folder for the specified interval, then automatically display the next picture in the folder.

# How do I Play or View My Media?

## Playing Music

1. From the main Media Control screen, touch . The My Music menu appears:

Touch the back arrow to navigate back through the folder hierarchy to the main screen menu.



If your installer/integrator set up the zone to use a NevoMedia Server, the My Music List View will be organized by folders:

- Albums
- Artists / Albums
- Artists / Titles
- Genres / Artists
- Genres / Titles
- All Titles
- Playlists

**Note:** If you've selected a different server, your folder options might be different. See the third-party media server manufacturer's documentation for details.

**Note:** Use **Media Collection | Import Playlist** on the NevoMedia Server to import any playlists you may have created (for example, using Windows Media Player). If your playlists are saved in a folder under My Music, NevoMedia Server will find them automatically. See the NevoMedia Server online help for details.

To select a folder, touch it, use the navigation arrow and **OK** keys, or use the toggle wheel.

### *Controlling Music Play*

To start play, navigate to the song you want to hear, then touch it, use the key arrows and **OK** key, or use the toggle wheel. Your choice begins playing in NevoMedia Player.

To see what's currently playing:

- Switch to the NevoMedia Player window on the player computer:




NevoMedia Player displays either a music image (depending on what is associated with the file type being played) or the Nevo logo, depending on which you select from the View menu:



See “How do I Use the Media Zones Menu?” on page 14 for other view options.

- Press the Details function key on Nevo<sup>SL</sup>:




This opens the control page:



Touch a control button to play/pause, skip to the beginning/end, or otherwise control music play. Use Nevo<sup>SL</sup>'s keys to control volume (up, down, or mute).

## Viewing Pictures

1. From the main Media Control screen, touch . The My Pictures menu appears:

**Touch the back arrow to navigate back through the folder hierarchy to the main screen menu.**



If you are using NevoMedia Server, the My Pictures List View is organized by whatever folders are present in the Windows My Pictures directory and whatever additional folders you have added using the Media Collection wizard (see “How do I Update My Media?” on page 8). This list contains any folders Media Server catalogs and identifies as having image files, even if those folders primarily store media of a different type. For example, if your My Music folder also contains album art images, the My Music folder will appear here.

If you are using a different server, the list view is organized according to how that server is set up. See the third-party media server manufacturer's documentation for details.

2. Select a folder by touching it, using the key arrows and **OK** key, or using the toggle wheel.
3. Navigate to the picture you want to view, then touch it, use the key arrows and **OK** key, or use the toggle wheel.

## Playing Videos

1. From the main Media Control screen, touch . The My Videos menu appears:

**Touch the back arrow to navigate back through the folder hierarchy to the main screen menu.**



The My Videos List View is organized by folders. This list contains any folders Media Server catalogs and identifies as having movie files. For example, if you stored a movie file in your My Pictures folder, the My Pictures folder will also appear here, even if it primarily contains still pictures.

If you are using a different server, the list view is organized according to how that server is set up. See the third-party media server manufacturer's documentation for details.

2. Select a folder by touching it, by using the key arrows and **OK** key, or by using the toggle wheel.

### *Controlling Video Play*

Navigate to the video you want to play, then touch it, use the key arrows and **OK** key, or use the toggle wheel.

Your choice begins playing in NevoMedia Player. From here, the actions are identical to those for playing music. See “Playing Music” on page 16 for details.

# 4 Nevo<sup>SL</sup> Settings

Your Nevo<sup>SL</sup> comes preset from your installer/integrator with the software you need to operate your home entertainment devices. There are some additional settings that you may want to customize yourself, if your installer/integrator has enabled these.

**Note:** If the Settings menu does not appear, contact your installer/integrator to change these settings.

Your installer/integrator may have set up a password to protect against unauthorized settings changes. If so, you will see the following screen before you can access the Settings screen:



Using the stylus and the input panel, enter the settings password. You may need to contact your installer/integrator for the password.

# Changing Power Settings

You can change a variety of power settings to prolong the battery life (the time between charges). Your installer/integrator has already configured your Nevo<sup>SL</sup> for optimal battery life.

To access the power settings:

1. Touch .
2. Touch **Settings**. The configuration menu appears:



3. Touch **Power**:



This screen displays the different power setting options:

- **On Battery**

The options you set will apply when Nevo<sup>SL</sup> is undocked and relying on its rechargeable battery. To conserve battery power and increase the length of time between charges, set these for as short as possible.

- **On AC Power**

The options you set will apply when Nevo<sup>SL</sup> is docked in the recharging station, using the electrical power from your outlet.

Both options contain the following settings:

- **Turn WiFi Off**

Set the time that should pass between when you last use Nevo<sup>SL</sup> and when it turns off the WiFi signalling. You can reactivate the signalling simply by touching the screen or any hard button.

- **Turn NevoSL off**

Set the time that should pass between when you last use Nevo<sup>SL</sup> and when it turns its hard drive off. You can reactivate Nevo<sup>SL</sup> simply by touching the screen or any hard button.

4. Touch **Close** to save your settings and return to the Settings screen.

## Changing Backlight Settings


You can change the amount of time the backlight stays on.

To access the power settings:

1. Touch .
2. Touch **Settings**. The configuration menu appears:



### 3. Touch **Backlight**:



This screen displays the different backlight setting options:

- **On Battery**  
The options you set will apply when Nevo<sup>SL</sup> is undocked and relying on its rechargeable battery. To conserve battery power and increase the length of time between charges, set these for as short as possible.
- **On AC Power**  
The options you set will apply when Nevo<sup>SL</sup> is docked in the recharging station, using the electrical power from your outlet.

Both options contain the following settings:

- Uncheck **Turn off backlight** if you want to leave the backlight on at all times.

**Caution.** If you leave the backlight on all the time on battery power, you can significantly increase how often you have to dock and recharge Nevo<sup>SL</sup>.

- Choose the amount of time the backlight should stay on.
- Slide the marker until the backlight is as bright or as dim as you want.

4. Touch **Close** to save your settings and return to the Settings screen.

## Setting the Date and Time

**Note:** Your installer/integrator may have disabled this feature. If so, and you use the stylus to turn Nevo<sup>SL</sup> off, you will be prompted to set the clock when you turn it back on.

Nevo<sup>SL</sup> includes a clock and calendar. To set it:

1. Touch .

2. Touch **Settings**. The configuration menu appears:



3. Touch **Date & Time**:



4. Touch the current date on the calendar.
5. Use the up and down arrows next to the time to set the time on the clock.
6. Open the list and select your time zone.
7. (Optional) Touch **Automatically adjust clock for daylight saving**.
8. Touch **Apply** to save your settings and remain on this screen.  
OR  
Touch **OK** to save your settings and return to the Settings menu.  
OR  
Touch **X** to return to the Settings menu without saving your changes.

## Calibrating the Screen

If you find that the Nevo<sup>SL</sup> touchscreen is not responding properly to your commands, you may need to calibrate the screen. To do so:

1. Touch .
2. Touch **Settings**. The configuration menu appears:



3. Touch **Calibration**:


Carefully press and briefly hold stylus  
on the center of the target.  
Repeat as the target moves  
around the screen.




4. Read the directions on screen, then touch the center of the + displayed. Follow the screen instructions.
5. At the last screen, touch the screen to save the recalibration data.

# NevoLink Settings

1. Touch .
2. Touch **Settings**. The configuration menu appears:



3. Touch **NevoLink**:



4. View the list of assigned and unassigned NevoLinks.
5. Touch **Refresh List** if you have added a new NevoLink and it does not yet appear.
6. Touch **Close** to return to the Settings screen.

## Changing Wireless Settings
